

THIS WEEK'S BIG READ: SPY PIGEONS

You might have heard of carrier pigeons, but have you ever heard of camera pigeons? During World War I, German inventors created tiny cameras that could be strapped to pigeons for secret missions. These clever devices allowed birds to take photographs of other countries from above.

Pigeons are able to fly closer to the ground than aeroplanes without being noticed, so these photographs were more detailed. Pigeons are naturally able to find their way home from any location, which meant that they were able to return the cameras safely after they had been used.
